YOUTH FORCE

Youth FORCE programs provide middle school students with year-round out-of-school-time services that include: case management, cultural enrichment activities, counseling, employability skills training, academic services and supports, pregnancy and drug prevention education, and community service learning activities. Additional program components may include mentoring, employability skills training, health and fitness activities, life skills instruction and violence prevention.

In 2003, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) published a report that estimated that the risk of infant suffocation increases 20-fold when infants and adults sleep in the same bed. In 2005, the AAP restated that co-sleeping is a growing concern and recommended that infants not share a bed during sleep.

The Safe Sleep Initiative provides low-income families with free GRACO Pack 'n Play® cribs, one crib sheet, and a safe-sleep sack, and counsels parents on the dangers of co-sleeping. In addition to educating parents on safe sleep practices, the Safe Sleep Coordinator will educate community stakeholders, such as first responders and service providers, physicians and other medical personnel who interact with families.

Broward County's SWIM Central program works with Broward County Public Schools and childcare centers to provide drowning prevention components, including:

- A minimum of six (6) and a maximum of ten (10) water safety lessons for participating children.
- A minimum of 25-30 minutes of water safety instruction per class with a maximum of 10 children per instructor.
- Water SMART Broward drowning prevention material, which includes water safety facts, data, and available resources. Additional educational classes are also offered to every family to provide basic water safety and drowning prevention information.
- In addition, the CSC funds coupons for free to low-cost instruction for Broward's children ages 6 months through 8 years, and the parent/caregiver of any child who redeems a child coupon is eligible to receive an adult coupon for themselves.

Drowning Prevention is a collaborative community effort driven by the Drowning Prevention Task Force. In 2009, the Children's Services Council allocated funding to support a full-time coordinator housed at the Broward County Health Department who provides insight and accountability for the implementation of the Drowning Prevention Action Plan.

Task Force members create a culture throughout Broward County that infuses drowning prevention methodologies, practices, and messages throughout the community, directly impacting families with young children by:

- Coordinating and disseminating an evidence-based water safety public message: Water SMART Broward
- Hosting water safety public outreach events
- Advocating regarding local ordinances and more.
- Students Preventing Unintentional Drownings (S.P.U.D.) are high school and middle school student clubs that mobilize, educate, and equip youth to prevent drownings and promote water safety practices.

HEAL Trauma (Healing and Empowering All Living with Trauma):

Provides services to disenfranchised and underserved populations experiencing trauma in the Northeast, Central East, and Southeast regions of Broward County. The programs utilize the Community Mental Health Worker (CMHW) model as a community engagement and empowerment strategy to increase access to and utilization of mental health services and help build upon existing community resiliency. Youth and families are connected with a trusted and trained community member (CMHW) who team up with the family to jointly identify family needs, including trauma services, and link the family to additional resources.
